

Home Learning Grid – Nursery Spring 2020



Here are some suggestions of activities to do at home over the next few weeks to support your child's learning. This term we will be reading some key traditional tales - Goldilocks and the Three Bears and Little Red Riding Hood. Try and read as regularly as you can with your child, whether its reading a whole story book, a comic, re-reading a favourite book or just looking at and talking about a couple of pages of a picture book. Grandparents, older siblings, Mums and Dads can all help.

Drawing

Can you draw a picture of Goldilocks, the Three Bears or the Big Bad Wolf! Don't forget to have a go at writing your name on it too - we can all try!



Talking

Encourage your child to retell the story of Goldilocks and The Three Bears and Little Red Riding Hood. Remind them to use different voices for the characters. Talk about Goldilocks - should she have gone into the bears house, or Little Red Riding Hood - how brave she was when she met a wolf. We use these stories to talk about keeping safe and taking risks

Managing Our Feelings

Talk to your child about their feelings and help them to understand how they can have different feelings at different times and that's OK. For eg feeling *excited* about going to see Grandparents, feeling *cross* when they have to put a toy away or feeling *surprised* when they are given a present. Encourage them to practice calming their bodies down if they feel angry, by walking away or taking some deep breaths.

Cooking

The children always enjoy cooking at Nursery. Why not make some steaming porridge like the three bears or maybe some cakes for grandma, like Little Red Riding Hood.
