


Home Learning Grid – Nursery Spring Term 2 2020



Here are some suggestions of activities to do at home over the next few weeks to support your child's learning.

Shape Walk

Take your child on a shape walk – a walk around the local environment during which you can identify as many shapes as you can such as a round traffic light, a rectangle shaped window or bus stop sign, zig zag lines next to the road crossing etc.



Planting

As we start to see signs of Spring and the weather improves, why not consider planting some seeds/bulbs and encourage your child to look after them. In nursery we will be planting potatoes and beans. What do the plants need to help them grow? You could experiment to find out where plants grow best eg in the light or in the dark?

Reading

Don't forget to read regularly with your child. You could read a whole story book, a comic, re-read (again!) a favourite story, look at an information book or just look at a couple of pages of a picture book. Why not visit Parson Cross library? They have a wonderful selection of books to engage all. Grandparents, older siblings, Mums and Dads can all help.

Baking



'Who will help me bake some bread?'
